#### **Spellings:**

#### Reading:

In Year 6, I expect children to be reading more than the minimum expectation.

Students have made an excellent start to their reading and writing curriculum this academic year. The Pathways program has introduced us to engaging texts that promote representation, equality, and high-quality writing skills.

**Core text:** In Writing this term, we'll be diving into the inspiring book *The Place* for Me: Stories About the Windrush Generation by Floella Benjamin. Through this exploration, students will work on crafting an engaging explanation text, drawing from the stories and experiences shared in the book.

**Reading text**: In Reading this term, we'll be exploring *Tyger* by SF Said. Our focus will be on developing skills in fact retrieval and sequencing, as we dive into the intriguing world of this story.

### **Mathematics**

**Core Maths lessons** – We are going to focus on key objectives throughout the Number units first and then move onto exploring fractions.

**Daily times table practise** – We will continue with our KFS times tables. We have completed our 10s, 5s and 2s – now we will move onto our 3s and 4s.

**Weekly times table test** – Each Friday, the class will complete their Cracking times table test.
